RE: WAR-US 42 Roundabouts (PID 107302), City of Mason
Project and Survey Notification

Dear Property Owner, Resident, or Business Owner:

The City of Mason is proposing improving US 42 from Bethany Road to Mason-Morrow-Millgrove Road (MMM). This project will change two existing stop controlled “T” intersections at Bethany Road and MMM to roundabouts. The project will also widen US 42 between the two intersections to a 3-lane section. The project also includes construction of a multi-use path that will connect SR 741 to US 42 along Bethany Road, then along US 42 to MMM and then along MMM to an existing path in the Mason Sports Park. Roadway improvements include storm sewers, multi-use path, sidewalk, curb and gutter, lighting, and utility relocation. Minor temporary and permanent right-of-way will be required for the project. This right-of-way will be primarily strip takes along the roadway. Construction is currently scheduled to start Spring 2022 and last approximately 15 months.

The project construction will require closure of Bethany Road at US 42 for up to 120 days. Traffic will be maintained via a detour using SR 741. At all other times, at least one lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained. Access will be maintained to all parcels throughout construction. Minor temporary impacts are anticipated to Mason Sports Park to construct the multi-use path and connect to the existing path in the Park. No closures are expected to the existing path.
